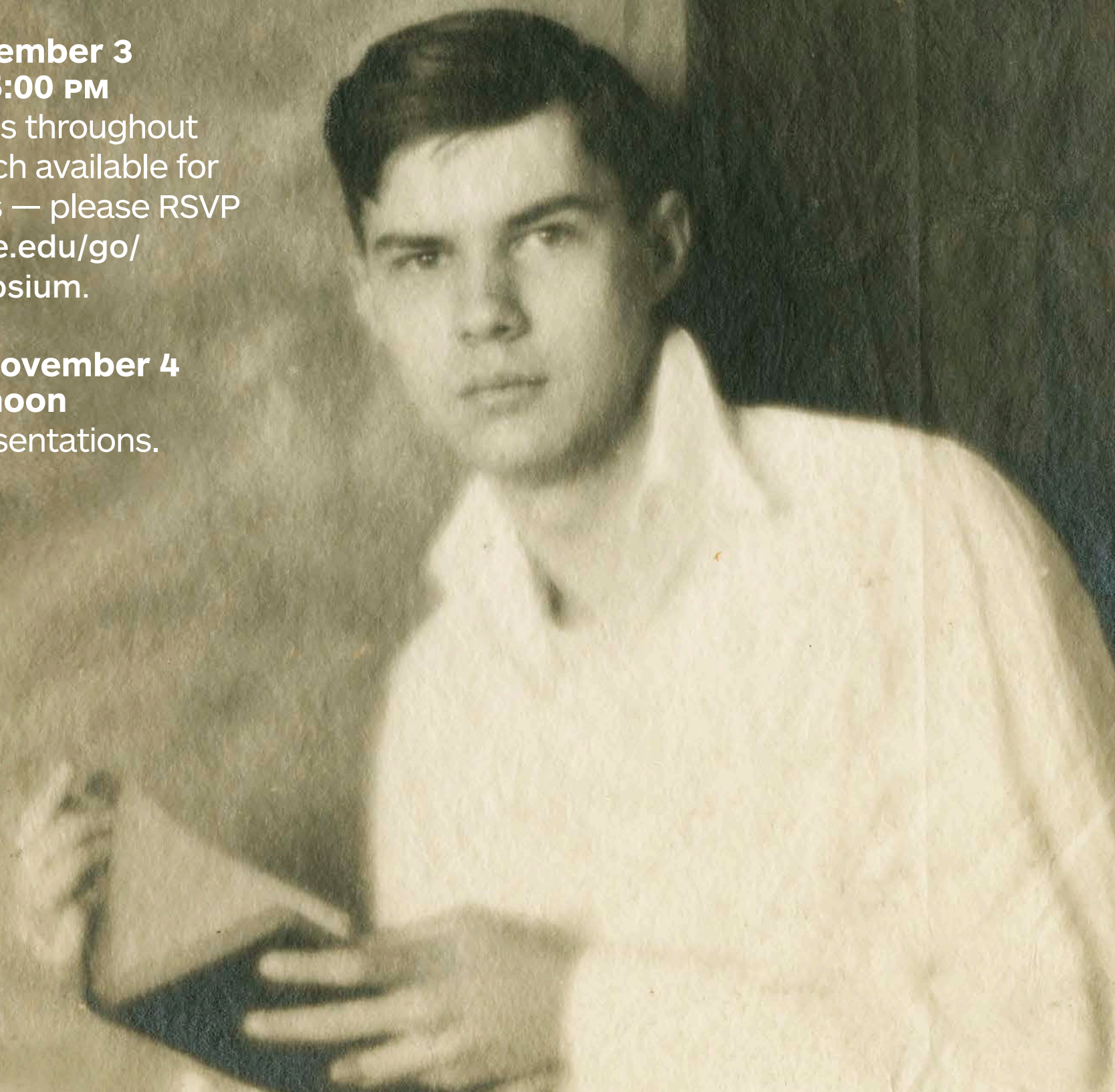


Leyda — a scholar,
